Financial Report:	<ul> <li>SCBC's Secretary/Treasurer, Tracy Bond, provided the annual Financial Report:         <ul> <li>The fiscal year we are reviewing is April 1, 2018 to March 31, 2019</li> <li>The format is designed with the Gaming Fund separated out to meet the BC Community Grant guidelines.</li> <li>We raised more funds that last year, most notably from the federal government. The Green Shores: Supporting Nature-based Solutions to Increase Resilience Project, supported by Natural Resources Canada, is one of our largest projects to date.</li> <li>Beyond the Federal Government, we received funds from the Provincial Community Gaming Grant, Foundations, Local Governments and raised other funds through small project delivery</li> <li>SCBC spending is within budget and under contracts</li> <li>The higher than normal net income is due to a timeline deliverable change in one of our contracts and is included in the SCBC 2019/2020 budget.</li> <li>The financials do not reflect this, but 33% of our total contributions come from in-kind support.
